Before the automobile, came the railroad, before Ford and the Dodge Brothers came Charles Lang Freer and Frank J. Hecker, and before Detroit became the nation's auto capital, it was the freight car manufacturing center of America. This powerhouse industry at the end of the 19th century was built by the extraordinary talents of Freer and Hecker, men whose vision and business acumen left an indelible mark on the economic, civic and cultural life of both Detroit and the nation.
